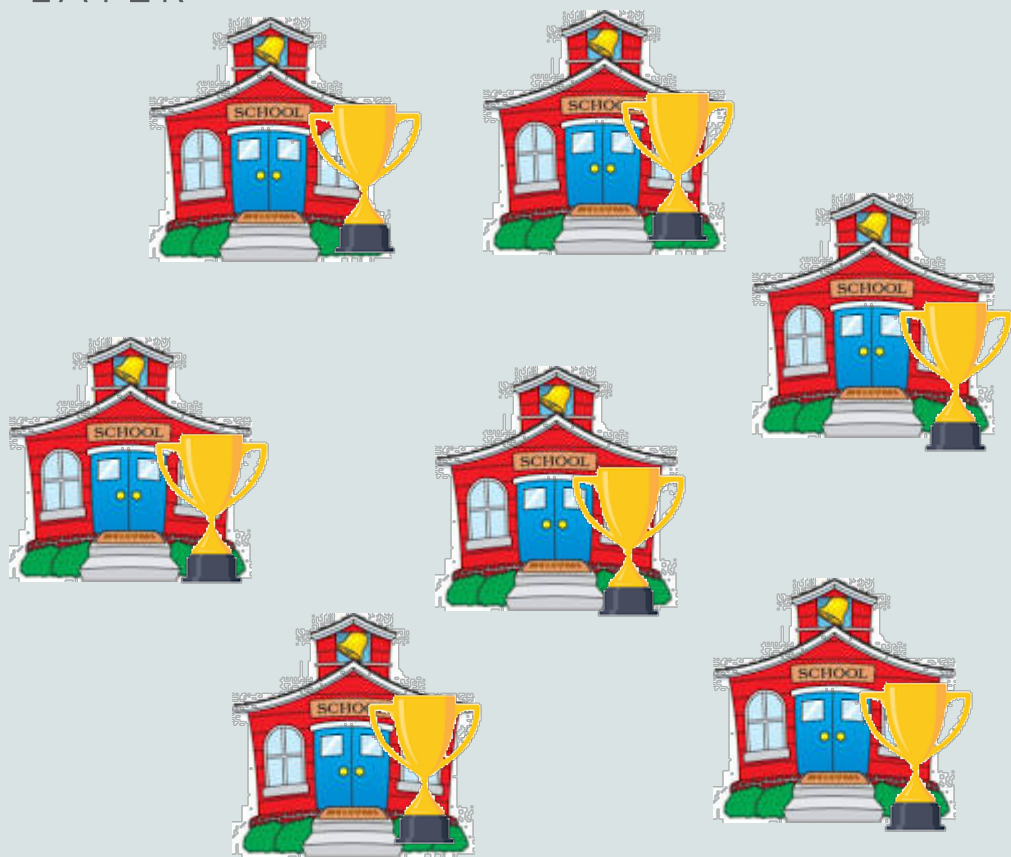
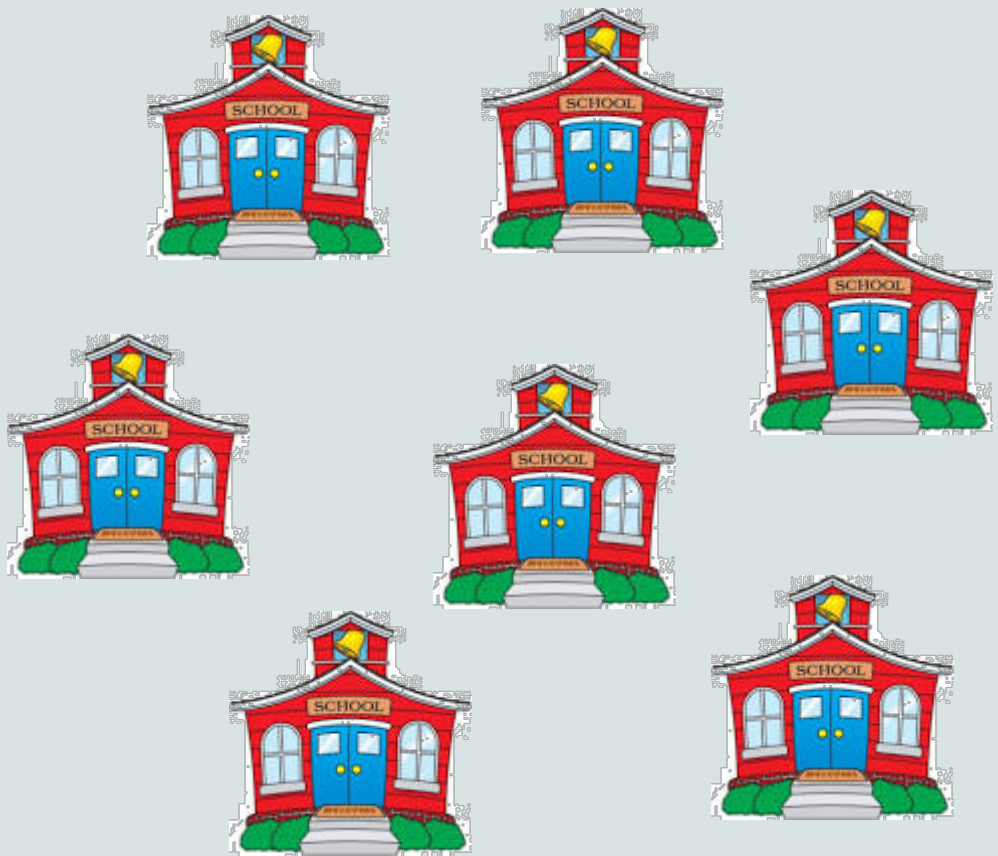

Cypress Trails Elementary School is an "A"-rated community public school located in the Village of Royal Palm Beach. We are committed to providing a world-class education and strive for each child to reach his or her highest potential. Our teams of highly qualified educators provide research-based instruction that focuses on the individual needs of our students.

In January 2015, we introduced the Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) curriculum to our students in grades K-2. Teachers and STEM coaches plan units of study on lions to engage students in Project Based Learning (PBL). Our Cypress "Pride" welcomes volunteers and enjoys hosting family events. Every trimester we have Learning Celebrations, STEM events, and Family nights thus encouraging family involvement.

Our after school enrichment programs support the whole child and there is something offered for everyone. The Singing Lions Chorus, Art Club, and Marathon Running Club participate in several community events and most run throughout the year. Academic Games, SECME, and the Green School teams are new this year and are science-based clubs.

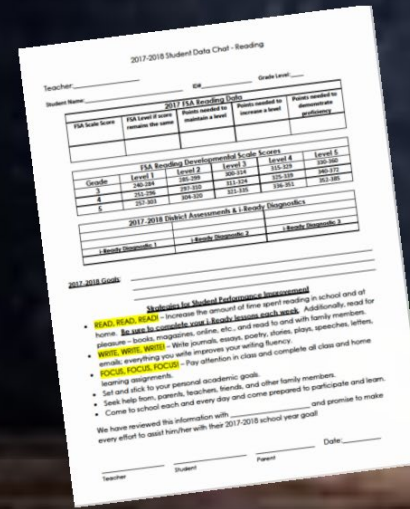
Class Average by Unit Assessment

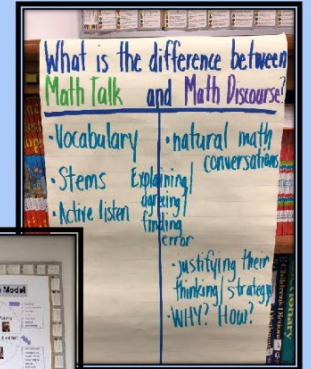
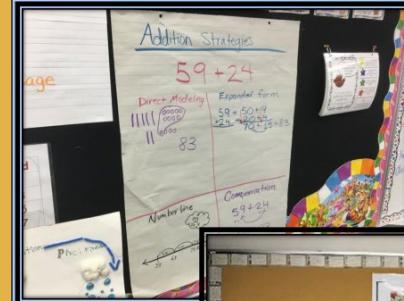

Introduce: At our school interventions take place at the same time, everyday and in every classroom. This best practice gained quick school-wide support and provided the opportunity to address the needs and strengths or all of our students.

...ON OUR S.T.E.A.M. VOYAGE TO NEW HORIZONS!

Monitor: This best practice is monitored using the Growth Monitoring Report from i-Ready, Weekly Cold Reads and quarterly data chats with administrators.

Model: Our school-wide intervention block, was introduced at the Opening of Schools meeting about 6 years ago. This best practice requires teamwork from special areas teachers who have an enrichment group, while intervention is being delivered to students by their homeroom teachers on a daily and consistent basis.

A twist on the intervention process, that ensures, all students receive the EXTRA support they need to be academically successful.

Evaluate: We measure success through the summative results from the administration of the FSA, SAT, and diagnostic results from i-Ready. Most importantly we measure our success based on the learning gains made by our students.

Impact: Our learning gains have improved consistently throughout the years since implementation. Our RtI process runs smoothly and collection of data is consistent.
