During the 2018-19 school year, the Bond and Pineview elementary schools were performing poorly, recording D and F grades, respectively.







Cypress Trails Elementary School is an "A"-rated community public school located in the Village of Royal Palm Beach. We are committed to providing a world-class education and strive for each child to reach his or her highest potential. Our teams of highly qualified educators provide research-based instruction that focuses on the individual needs of our students.

In January 2015, we introduced the Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) curriculum to our students in grades K-2. Teachers and STEM coaches planed units of study on lions to engage students in Project Based Learning (PBL). A unique partnership with Lion Country Safari has enabled our students to connect live using a grant funded POLY-COM system that allows students and staff to interact live with scientists, zookeepers, and veterinarians. This experience provides the opportunity to learn about science careers while studying animals, animal care and animal conservation. We are eager to introduce STEM studies to our intermediate grades during the 2015-2016 school year. Cypress Trails will also offer this innovative program to others as a school of CHOICE.


