**Jennifer S. Miller, M.Ed.**

For twenty-five years, Jennifer Miller has worked with educators and families to help them become more effective with children through social and emotional learning (SEL). She is author and illustrator of the book ["Confident Parents, Confident Kids: Raising Emotional Intelligence In Ourselves and Our Kids"](#) and her blog has more than 23,000 followers in 152 countries world-wide. She serves as a regular expert contributor to NBC's TODAY Parenting and to PBS WNET. She writes and offers expertise for numerous publications including *The Washington Post*, *The Huffington Post*, and *Parent Magazine*. She conducted and published original peer-reviewed research with partner scholars entitled, *"Parenting for Competence and Parenting with Competence: Essential Connections between Parenting and Social and Emotional Learning."* She recently co-founded SEL for Ohio, a statewide network to champion social and emotional learning. She serves on the Tauck Family Foundation's Advisory Committee along with members from Child Trends, Yale Center for Emotional Intelligence, and Harvard's School of Education. She consults with schools, conducts research and creates tools on parenting and SEL with partners at the University of Pittsburgh, Montana State University, and the Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning at the University of Illinois at Chicago. She frequently speaks at conferences, offers coaching to parents, and conducts workshops in Ohio and nationally. She has her master's degree in Instructional Leadership with a focus on social and emotional development and lives with her husband and thirteen-year-old son in Columbus, Ohio.
